## Book Report Guidelines – 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade

- Paper headed properly – name and date in top left corner
- Type report – size 12 font, double space, black ink
- Written in 5 paragraph format
  - Paragraph 1 – includes title, author, and theme. (All titles of books must be italicized when typed.)  
5 Sentence minimum!!
  - Paragraph 2 – description of the setting, when the story occurred, and where it occurred.  
5 Sentence minimum!!
  - Paragraph 3 – description of the main characters (age, appearance, personality)  
5 Sentence minimum!!
  - Paragraph 4 – briefly summarize the plot of the story. Do not retell the story.  
5 Sentence minimum!!
  - Paragraph 5 – evaluate the book. Tell what you liked or did not like about the book. Always support your opinion by giving a brief example from the story.  
5 Sentence minimum!!
